The consulting services in the district of Coesfeld are open to all families, free-of-charge regardless of nationality and religion. All conversations are private and subject to confidentiality.

This guide answers many questions:

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Who can help me when I am pregnant? Or once the baby is here?

The **obstetrician** assesses your health condition and that of your unborn child during pregnancy.

Every four weeks, you go for a check-up at your obstetrician's office. In the last two months before birth, the check-ups are every two weeks.





You get a **prenatal passport** from the obstetrician. This includes your blood type, ultrasound results and other prenatal records. During the pregnancy, you should always keep the prenatal passport with you and bring it with you to appointments.

The doctor's visit is voluntary and helps the doctor identify any early illnesses your child might have.



You will either need a treatment certificate or an electronic health insurance card - enquire in time at the Town Hall where you live.

You may bring one person of your choice to the check-up appointments. That way you have support during this exciting event and someone with whom you can go over your questions again later.

Who can help me when I am pregnant? Or once the baby is here?

For pregnant women and families with a young child, there is a **pregnancy counselling center**. In case of problems with your partner or within the family, you can receive support from specialists starting from the antepartum period up until your child is three years old. They provide information on antepartum examination methods, in questions regarding sexuality and contraception.

Money for the child:

The specialists will also help you if you do not earn enough money or have no money saved. In this case you will receive money for the initial necessities needed for your baby. This includes a bed and clothes. You will also receive information on additional financial assistance.

Who can help me when I am pregnant? Or once the baby is here?

The midwife is an expert on all questions concerning pregnancy, birth and childcare. And accompanies you during your pregnancy and onwards. Every woman can make use of the assistance of a midwife. The health insurance companies cover the costs for midwives. You do not need to pay for this.



You will either need a treatment certificate or an electronic health insurance card - enquire in time at the Town Hall where you live.



The support of a midwife ensures that your child has the optimal conditions for his start in life.

Where can I get additional support after the baby is born?

A family midwife will help you until your child is 1 year old, sometimes even up to 3 years old. When things become overwhelming. You are afraid of doing something wrong. Or other problems arise. For example, an argument with your partner. Health problems. No work.



A family midwife comes to your home and helps you with many things:

- She shows you how to feed and swaddle the baby.
- She tells you when you need to take the baby to a paediatrician.
- She gives recommendations. For example, what food is good for you and the baby. Or what you should do when the baby cries.
- She will help you with applications and forms. For example, for parental and child benefits.
- She tells you what offers exist for pregnant women and mothers with babies. And introduces you to other mothers.
- She helps you with problems in the family.

A family midwife is here for you. Free-of-charge. So that you can provide for your and your child's well-being.

Is my child developing appropriately? And what do I do if my child is sick?

For children, there are paediatricians who will examine your child when it is sick. In the first 6 years of your child's life, you can also go to early detection examinations at regular intervals.

This is what the paediatrician does:

- He examines your child and determines if it is developing well.
- He gives important advice.
- He talks to you about vaccinations. Because vaccinations can protect children from many infectious diseases.
- He vaccinates your child.
- He answers your questions.

The paediatrician records the examination results in the **yellow examination booklet**. You take this booklet to each checkup.

He enters the vaccinations into the **vaccination passport**. The examinations at the paediatrician's office are **free-of-charge**.





You will either need a treatment certificate or an electronic health insurance card - enquire in time at the Town Hall where you live.

Take your child to the check-ups. This is very important for his healthy development. This way you can take good care of your child.

How can I better understand my child? Where can I exchange ideas with other parents?

In family centres and family education centres, there are helpful educational opportunities for parents and their children. The activities usually take place in a small group and are accompanied by a specially trained person. Many offers are **free-of-charge**.

Here, mothers and fathers can

- learn to better understand their baby's "language"
- consciously experience and promote the development of their child
- ask questions about managing the baby and its siblings, and get suggestions and pointers for everyday life
- play with their child and have fun.

In the group, you can meet parents of other children. You can exchange ideas with them.

Who can I ask for advice if I do not know how to cope? Where can I get help for me and my child?

In the district of Coesfeld there are many professional people who can help you and your child during difficult times. In a face-to-face conversation, they can help look for solutions for your family. In some instances,



the consultants of these centers can also come to your home if you want. The counseling is **free-of-charge**.

Who helps me and my child when the problems in the family become too much?

The Youth Welfare Office helps parents or single mothers and fathers when conversations are no longer sufficient.



Help for life with a child:

The Youth Welfare Office helps if you want more support in raising your child. Experts then organize free help to come to your home for a while.

This is called: **Help with child-rearing.**





Money for the child:

The Youth Welfare Office can help if you are a single parent and do not get any money from the other parent. The Youth Welfare Office pays the child support.

This is called: alimony advance.





Rules for contact with the child:

The Youth Welfare Office helps when the child predominantly lives with one parent after a separation. Then the Youth Welfare Office discusses the rules for the meeting with your child with you and the other parent.

We call this: Provisional contact arrangements.

Where can my child play with other children and be well cared for?

Your child can be cared for in a day-care facility or with childminders. Your child with be able to play in a beautiful environment with other children. They can learn singing and painting and be out in the fresh air. Your child receives breakfast every day.

You can accompany your child to the day-care facility for the first few times. There you will get to know the childcare providers.

S The law states: As soon as your child is 1 year old, they are entitled to placement in a childcare facility.

Register your child in time for childcare. You can register your child at the daycare facility or at the Youth Welfare Office.

Different languages are most welcome!

The Youth Welfare Offices and family centers can advise and help you to find a childcare facility.

Where can I find activities for families in my area?

In a family centre, there are different offers for children and their parents:

- Recovery after pregnancy
- ,Weighing hour' for parents with their baby
- Parent meetings where you can get to know other Parents
- Parents' evenings with themes all around the child
- Activities and excursions for the whole family

The family centre offers personal consulting services. The specialists at the family centre even help you look for a paediatrician or a midwife near you as well as a childcare facility.

Where can I get financial support for my child before and after birth?



The helpline "Violence against women" is a nationwide counselling service for women who have experienced or are still experiencing violence. It is available 24/7, 365 days a



year, free-of-charge at the **number 08 00 01 16 016** and online at www. hilfetelefon.de and includes arranged and instant chat services as well as e-mail. The counsellors inform and consult anonymously, in 15 languages as well as in German sign language and easy to understand speech.
